CLEARANCE CERTIFICATES

Who Needs Them & How Do You Get Them

In accordance with Commonwealth of Pennsylvania laws now in effect for Volunteers who have "Direct Volunteer Contact" with children must have Clearance Certificates. That is, volunteers who care for, supervise, guide or control a child or children AND have routine-interaction-with-a-child-or-children will need Clearance Certificates.

The Clearance Certificates are portable (among volunteering jobs) but must have been issued within the past five years. Once used, they are valid for five years and only for volunteering.

The Exeter Community Library has deemed that volunteers ages 14 to 18 will be exempt from requiring Clearance Certificates. All adults over 18 are required to obtain their Clearance Certificates due to the presence of children regularly in the library.

- PA Child Abuse History Clearance (CY113)
 - o FREE for Volunteers
- PA State Police Criminal Record Check (SP4-164)
 - FREE for Volunteers
- Federal Criminal History Report (FBI Fingerprinting)
 - Volunteers only need this if they have lived in PA for less than the past 10 years
