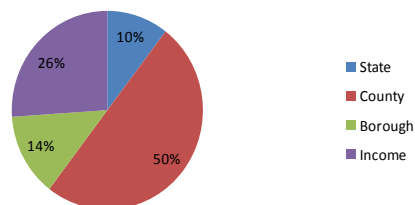

2012 by the numbers

32,829 people visited the Womelsdorf Community Library during 2,060 open hours.

4,966 children, teens and adults attended 363 library programs.

2,202 people are active library users.

12,690 sessions on the public internet computers and wi-fi use.

61,100 items were checked out of the library.

1,850 new items were added to the collection.

5,039 reference questions were answered.

10,955 items requested in from other libraries.

10,783 items sent to other libraries.

201 children and teens participated in the 2012 Summer Reading Program.

520 audio books

336 music CDs
